bama to Select Genachowski to Lead F.C.C.



Julius Genachowski at a **Conference in Tel Aviv in 2006** President-elect Barack Obama intends to nominate Julius Genachowski, an adviser on technology issues and longtime friend, to become the next chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, advisers to Mr. Obama said.

During the campaign, Mr. Genachowski shaped many of Mr. Obama's telecom policies. He advocated an open Internet in the debate over so-called "net neutrality," and media-ownership rules that promote a diversity of voices on the airwaves.

He was chief counsel to Reed Hundt, a chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, during the Clinton administration. He then worked for eight years as a senior executive at Barry Diller's IAC/Interactive Corporation. He also founded an investment and advisory firm for digital media companies and co-founded the country's first commercial "green" bank

Mr. Genachowski, 46 years old, is a former Harvard Law School classmate of Mr. Obama. He previously worked at the FCC during the Clinton administration. More recently, he co-founded LaunchBox Digital, a Washington, D.C.-based venture capital firm. He worked at Barry Diller's IAC/InterActive Corp. in various executive positions for eight years after leaving the FCC. He worked for the commission at a time when they were better disposed to listening to the problems of Amateur Radio during the period when Riley Hollingsworth was appointed.

Mr. Genachowski couldn't be reached for comment. A spokeswoman for the Obama transition team declined to comment. During the campaign, Mr. Genachowski served as the top technology adviser to Mr. Obama, putting together a detailed technology and innovation plan that expressed support for open Internet or "net neutrality" protections; media-ownership rules that encourage more diversity; and expansion of affordable broadband access across the country.

An early supporter of the president-elect, Mr. Genachowski also served as a bundler for the campaign, raising more than \$500.000 in donations.

If confirmed, Mr. Genachowski will take over an agency that has had rocky relations with Congress and major companies in the telecommunications industry under current FCC Chairman Kevin Martin. The agency may also still be coping with the U.S.'s transition to digital-only television, which is scheduled to take place Feb. 17 but could be pushed back to the summer. While at IAC, Mr. Genachowski served several roles at the media and e-commerce conglomerate, first as general counsel and later as head of business development and part of the top core of executives.

Earthquake Strikes Costa Rica, Emergency Ham Frequency Declared

On Thursday, January 8 at 1921z, an earthquake measuring 6.2 on the Richter scale struck the Central American country of Costa Rica. The earthquake, with an epicenter located about 22 miles northeast of San Jose, comes after a series of almost 60 seismic events that have rocked the country since early this week.

The Radio Club de Costa Rica (RCCR) -- that country's IARU Member-Society -- is monitoring local repeaters and 7090 kHz. IARU Region 2 Emergency Communications Coordinator Cesar Pio Santos, HR2P, requests that 7090 kHz be kept clear of non-essential traffic due to possible emergency communications dealing with the earthquake. The ARRL encourages all amateurs to be aware of the emergency operations on this frequency. US amateurs should avoid interfering with Spanish language SSB while using digital modes.

A Helpful Solder Technique W1AW 2009 Winter Operating Schedule

Where I work, the employees have a few processes we have to become familiar with. Mine is wood working. One of my bosses specializes in voicing and solder together pipes for the pipe organs that we build and refurbish. Among the many different materials that need to be solder are lead, tin, zinc, spotted zinc, and a few others I can't think of right now. In any case, the soldering irons and hatchets he uses require a very clean and tinned heated soldering tool. In order to keep the tool tinned, he uses a block of something called "Sal Ammoniac".

It is used by people who assemble stained glass, professionally. It's a block of a white substance that creates a considerable amount of smoke when a very high temperature impure soldering substance hits it. It seems that its main goal is to keep your soldering tool tinned and clean. A drop of melted solder is applied to the block, then a hot ironing tip is rolled into this drop. the block makes sure that the iron is cleaned and evenly tinned.

If rubbing your hot soldering iron in a wet sponge just doesn't cut the mustard, you might want to try this "Sal Ammoniac".

A DX bulletin replaces or is added to the regular bulletins between 0100 UTC (8 PM EST) Thursdays and 0100 UTC (8 PM EST) Fridays.

In a communications emergency, monitor W1AW for special bulletins as follows: Voice on the hour, Teleprinter at 15 minutes past the hour, and CW on the half hour.

All licensed amateurs may operate the station from 1500 UTC to 1700 UTC (10 AM to 12 PM EST), and then from 1800 UTC to 2045 UTC (1 PM to 3:45 PM EST) Monday through Friday. Be sure to bring your current FCC amateur radio license or a http://www.arrl.org/w1aw.html photocopy.

Due to intermittent power at our TARA repeater site, everyone was asked to consider that we were operating on Emergency battery back-up and try to keep transmissions to a minimum for the first three days after the storm until we were sure that our power was not going to be interrupted at the Repeater site. As a result, the

TARA repeater never went down.
