

SKYWARN RECOGNITION DAYLOCAL PACKET RADIO USEA GREAT SUCCESSON THE RISE AGAIN

SKYWARN Recognition Day (SRD) was held on Saturday, December 4, 2005. This 24 hour event began at 0000 UTC. As of Mid November, more than 65 NWS offices were registered to participate. Thanks to Jeff Dovyak (VE4MBQ), the Canadian Weather Service was also be represented by operations at the Prairie Storm Prediction Centre in Winnipeg. NWS Officials were hopeful that they would have around 100 weather offices participating this year. The December issue of QST magazine also has a short article about SRD.

Remember to check the official SRD web site at: <u>http://hamradio.noaa.gov/.</u> They asked that amateur radio Operators review the information for their station and inform David Floyd about any corrections that need to be made.

There was also a great response and numerous check-ins thru Echolink and IRLP via the WXTALK Conference. NWS Officals throughout the US and Canada tried Echolink with great success.

Several Questions had been sent to Dave: - Do we need to operate for the entire 24 hour period? No. Work as many hours as you want. I estimate about 50% of the offices work the 24 hours. Others work between 8 and 12 hours during Saturday morning and afternoon.

What frequencies could be used ?

This is a common question. The answer is "any one that is free" on the General section of the 10, 15, 20, 40, and 80 meter bands. You could also use any VHF/UHF frequency other than the national calling frequencies. There was not a band plan for the event. If the bands get extremely crowded, amateurs could move to the Extra portions of the bands assuming you have a control operator who is licensed in the Extra class.

What's all that racket on 144.91 Mhz? Well, it's the sound of PACKET RADIO again! It seems that Packet Radio here in Rensselaer County might be making a come back, of sorts. Lately we've been seeing a good number of the old Packet faithful making a return to the air. Also, the TARA sponsored NODE & BBS is experiencing a lot more traffic these day's.

If you haven't been on Packet for awhile that's okay, it might all seem new again to you. However, you still can have some fun and it makes a good learning experience for many that want to get their feet wet in the field of digital communication. If you're into APRS or you think you might be interested there are a lot of advancements that have taken place over the last couple of year's. But don't take my word for it...Fire up your TNC and see for yourself! Personally, I've been trying to get as many of you to fire up those TNC's and put them back on 144.91 MHz. I hope you'll join us soon and let's see if we can't show our support of this great amateur resource.

Also, Stan -WA2UET from RVWARS has advised us that if anyone is interested and has the equipment, Marty N2LDR has a BBS up on 223.440 with a call N2LDR-1.

The RIPPERS also have a BBS up on 145.030 with the call K2RVW-1...Feel free to play at will. They are there for practice and fun for anyone that can try it.

If you want to be prepared for emergency communications, Packet radio is extremely useful for traffic handling that will give you a means of passing traffic that you will be able to maintain a written copy of. So get out that old laptop that is gathering dust. Hook it up to your TNC with one of your extra Handheld radios and you have an automatic GO-KIT for emergency communications. Also you will be all hooked up for other digital communications modes.

You say that Packet is an old and ancient mode. WRONG !!

If this mode is so outdated, then why have public service gone to digital data communications terminals in patrol vehicles. Look in many of the police cars in your towns and cities and you will see these terminals in the patrol cars, which are nothing more than a sophisticated packet system.






LETTER OF APPRECIATION FROM THE N.Y.S.P.



On Tuesdays and Fridays at 2330 UTC (6:30 PM EST), Keplerian Elements for active amateur satellites are sent on the regular teleprinter frequencies.

A DX bulletin replaces or is added to the regular bulletins between 0100 UTC (8 PM EST) Thursdays and 0100 UTC (8 PM EST) Fridays.

In a communications emergency, monitor W1AW for special bulletins as follows: Voice on the hour, Teleprinter at 15 minutes past the hour and CW on the half hour.

FCC licensed amateurs may operate the station from 1500 UTC to 1700 UTC (10 AM to 12 PM EST), and then from 1800 UTC to 2045 UTC (1 PM to 3:45 PM EST) Monday through Friday. Be sure to bring your current FCC amateur license or a photocopy.

CQ to Celebrate 60TH Anniversary On Air with " CQ GANG " Event

Hicksville, New York -- CQ Amateur Radio magazine is inviting amateur radio operators around the world to join in its 60th anniversary by taking part in an on-air celebration during the first 60 days of 2005. CQ's first issue was published in January, 1945. During the "CO Gang" activity, from January 1 to March 1, 2005, any ham who has ever had an association with CQ magazine -- as a staff member, contributing editor, author, etc. -- as well as current subscribers to CQ, CQ VHF and Popular Communications magazines may sign "/60" after his or her callsign. Certificates will be issued for contacts with enough "/60" stations to garner a minimum of 60 contact points, based on number of contacts times the number of different position multipliers (e.g., editor, columnist, etc.) worked. Shortwave listeners may also qualify by monitoring enough contacts for a minimum of 60 contact points. Endorsements will be issued for scores up to 600 points. In addition, CQ club station WW2CQ will be activated from various parts of the United States during the event period. A separate certificate will be available for working WW2CQ in all call areas from which it is active. Details on that portion of the activity will be released later. Complete rules for the CO Gang 60th Anniversary activity are in the December, 2004 issue of CQ magazine, and by going to the magazine's website at http://www.cq-amateur-radio.com (http://www.cqamateur-radio.com/) and clicking the link at the bottom of the home page.
