


PUMPKIN PATROL 2012

Kenneth T. Davis, Jr., KB2KFV, former Green Island Chief of Police, died Monday, September 3, 2012 at the Samaritan Hospital in Troy after being stricken ill at his home. A native and lifelong resident of Green Island, he was son of the late Kenneth and Muriel O'Donnell Davis. He was a graduate of St. Joseph's School in Green Island, LaSalle Institute in Troy and Hudson Valley Community College. Ken started his career in law enforcement as a dispatcher for the Green Island Police Department. He followed in his father's footsteps becoming a patrolman in 1974, sergeant in 1981 and served as chief from 1992 until retiring in 1996. Ken was a communicant of the former St. Joseph's Church in Green Island, a member of the Troy Amateur Radio Association, where he served as past












Winter Storm Names - A New Concept




